In this atlas we have tried to illustrate conditions seen regularly in our clinics as well as some seen more rarely but which are nevertheless important to recognize. We have limited the number of illustrations in order to produce a realistically-priced book and thus it has not always been easy to decide what to include and what to omit. However, we hope that we have produced a reasonably comprehensive work. We hope that this atlas will have a wide appeal both at home and abroad. It is a book either to read or to browse through. It is intended for senior medical students, family practitioners, and for trainees both in dermatology and in paediatrics. We would like it actually taken to skin clinics to be available for instant perusal, and to be on hand in the paediatric ward. We have said comparatively little about treatment because this alters regularly and often varies in different centres and because we do not think that an atlas is the place for this.
