

Organon Of Medicine

The Organon of Medicine - 5th and 6th edition by Samuel Hahnemann and translated by R.E. Dudgeon was published in 1970. It is a combination of the revised 5th Edition by Dudgeon (1893) and 6th edition by Boericke. Dudgeon's revision was an effort to make a more exact reproduction of the original. Dudgeon added an appendix to his edition wherein he features the important variations of the previous editions. This presents a detailed history of the origin, growth and progress of the homeopathic system of medicine. It's an excellent learning process to see the changes in Hahnemann's thinking from the 5th to the 6th edition. This further facilitates side-by-side comparison of the text. Some of the paragraphs were modified, some were re-written completely and others were eliminated. As opposed to the view that the 6th edition is late in the life aberration, Dudgeon's work clearly shows the evolutionary development that occurred.

This book, which is written by the master is a treasure trove of therapeutics. Every word in the aphorism conveys to the reader a story behind it.

Homeopathy or homoeopathy is a pseudoscientific system of alternative medicine. It was created by Samuel Hahnemann. Its practitioners, called homeopaths, believe that a substance that causes symptoms of a disease in healthy people would cure similar symptoms in sick people; this doctrine is called "similia similibus curentur," or "like cures like". The term "homeopathy" was coined by Hahnemann which comes from

the Greek: *hómoios*, "like" and *páthos*, "suffering".

Hahnemann gathered and published a complete overview of his new medical system in his book, *The Organon of the Healing Art*, whose 6th edition, known as *Organon of Medicine*, is still relevant today. Homeopathic healing is considered controversial and it received a lot of critique over the years, but it still survived and is practiced today. "Without disparaging the services which many physicians have rendered to the sciences auxiliary to medicine, to natural philosophy and chemistry, to natural history in its various branches, and to that of man in particular, to anthropology, physiology and anatomy, etc., I shall occupy myself here with the practical part of medicine only, with the healing art itself, in order to show how it is that diseases have hitherto been so imperfectly treated. Far beneath my notice is that mechanical routine of treating precious human life according to the prescription manuals, the continual publication of which shows, alas! how frequently they are still used. I pass it by unnoticed, as a despicable practice of the lowest class of ordinary practitioners. I speak merely of the medical art as hitherto practiced, which, pluming itself on its antiquity, imagines itself to possess a scientific character."

The Organon developed slowly out of Hahnemann's thinking and experimentation. The Organon went through six editions. The sixth edition was ready for print in 1842, but Hahnemann died before it could be printed. Just before the turn of the century, Drs William Boericke and James Wiffiam Ward paid \$1,000 to purchase Organon from the Boenninghausen family. The sixth edition finally appeared in print in Germany in 1921 and in the United States in 1922. The edition was typeset around 80 years ago. The modern reader finds it difficult to read and go through the book. For the past few years the publishers has been constantly requested to reproduce this treasure

in a manner which is consistent with modern books. To make the book user-friendly it has been refurbished. The positive changes we made are as follows: Footnotes which were earlier given at the bottom were difficult to find and read. Organon of Medicine, originally Organon of the Art of Healing, is a book by Samuel Hahnemann in which he laid out the doctrine of his ideas of homoeopathy. The book is considered the most important work in the field. Hahnemann wrote this book in order to document his new system of medicine. After conducting personal observations and experiments, Hahnemann published his new account of homoeopathy in book form. The book begins with a preface by the author on the subject, with a vast introduction to the subject, the philosophy and the presentation of how Homoeopathy became a method of practice in the medical profession. Organon of Medicine is split into "Aphorisms", numbered 1 to 294.
